Diagnosis

Symptoms

- Back, buttock or leg pain
- Difficulty walking
- Numbness in your legs, calves, or buttocks
- Weakness and / or loss of balance

Potential Causes

- Degenerative disc
- Painful facet joints
- Spinal stenosis
- Spondylolisthesis
- Scoliosis
- Spinal Fractures
 - Failed prior fusion



Provocative Tests













Indications For Surgery



- Pain longer than 4-6 months
- At least 3 positive provocative tests
- X-Ray & CT/MRI imaging
- 75% improvement with injection
- Steroid injection at least once
- Pain over the SI Joint

Post-Op

- Follow up with your doctor
- Keep incision dry for 7-10 days
- Take antibiotics for 5-7 days
- Pain medications as prescribed
- NO NSAIDS
- NO smoking

- Walk as tolerated
- No lifting above 10 lbs
- Physical therapy
- Use brace as prescribed
- Consult your doctor: bending, driving, exercising
